REPORT ON REMEDIAL COACHING PROGRAMME

FROM JUNE 2022- MARCH 23

The remedial coaching programme aims to support weak learners in different subjects and provides them teaching support to enhance their subject knowledge and to face university exam without fear. The Remedial coaching committee of the academic year 2022-23 was constituted with the following faculties Kavtha.A.C(Convenor)Dr.Haseena.A,Dr.Rathi.R, Dr.Sumathy.M, NazirenBegum, SavithriN .V,Likitha.P and Saranya.K.P

A well prepared guidelines approved by Principal regarding remedial programme was sent to all department mail. A whatsapp group of faculty engaged in remedial class was also created to communicate information.

In this academic year, the college decided to organize remedial class from the start of the July itself. Priority was given to those students who have arrears in university exam, absentees and slow learners. Weak students were identified by the tutors on the basis of their performance in the internal exams. Though we kept aside for 30 hours per semester for remedial class, some departments could provide only less than 30 because of hectic schedule in the department.

Remedial classes are organised to help the students who had missed their regular classes for some reason (sports, sickness)

and could not get their concepts clear in their regular classes. The classes were held in time slots chosen by the teachers according to their and their students' convenience for the entire period of remedial classes. It was decided to provide atleast 30 class per semester. Despite hectic schedule, our faculties took sincere effort to prepare slow learners for their exam. Around 33 teachers from various departments volunteered to take these classes to help out the students in need. 252 students participated in the remedial programme.

The following is a brief report on student participation in our college in the academic year 2022-23, based on the data provided by the various departments.
