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PREFACE

Chittur Government College NSS Units organized service activities for the year 2021-2023. Post-covid, colleges have opened and students are setting an example by upholding the ideals of social service and personal development. After various developmental programs and service activities, the students participated in the seven-day camp and showed their strength and camaraderie alike. Students fulfill their responsibilities as NSS volunteers through voluntary activities like palliative care and blood donation camp which inculcate social awareness apart from various types of cleaning activities.

Activity report for the year 2021-23 is also enclosed herewith.

2022

1/6/2022: The NSS students were grouped and assigned to clean different sections of the college, starting at 10:30 a.m. All section authorities provided full support, and the waste was sorted, collected, and disposed of. The work was completed by 12 noon, and all 88 volunteers returned.

18/06/2022: The NSS volunteers led the cleaning and arrangement of books in the library starting at 9:30 a.m. The work was done in different groups as instructed by the librarians. The number of arranged books was recorded, and food was served. There were 83 NSS volunteers who participated in the program.

23/06/2022: NSS and the College Library organized a Reading Quiz from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. Many students participated in the three-round competition. The six students with the highest scores in the first round advanced to the second round, and three of them entered the final round. Krishnanjali, a third-year Malayalam student, won the competition. The event had 50 NSS volunteers.

25/06/2022: 68 NSS volunteers went to the hostel at 9:30 a.m. to move benches, chairs, and other furniture from the old hostel to the new one. The work was completed by 12:30 p.m., and the volunteers left for food.

04/08/2022: NSS volunteers led the scholarship award ceremony for economically disadvantaged students at 10 a.m. at Mahatma Gandhi Hall

4 under the GCC Alumni Association. The program was successful with 75 NSS volunteers participating, and ideas for change were discussed.

10/08/2022: At 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, NSS volunteers created placards for the college's 75th year. Each group prepared five placards, and the work was completed by noon. The program had 60 NSS volunteers.

11/08/2022: A rally was held by NSS volunteers and teachers from different departments on Thursday at 10 a.m. as part of the college's 75th anniversary celebration. Each department had a different dress code, and cultural activities were held. Despite the rain, 65 NSS volunteers participated in the event.

12/08/2022: In connection with Independence Day, NSS volunteers painted a picture of Ayyankali, a Kerala freedom fighter, on the wall of the New Block building. There were 25 NSS volunteers who participated on Sunday.

14/08/2022: On the occasion of Independence Day, 55 NSS volunteers participated in the Azadi program, hoisted flags at their homes, and uploaded pictures to the Azadi app. They also received certificates from the central government.

15/08/2022: The Independence Day celebrations began at 9 a.m. with an NSS prayer, and the flag was hoisted by the college principal. Sweets were

5 distributed, and the students of the ladies' hostel cooked and served payasam. NSS volunteers took a picture under the flag and parted ways with applause. There were 54 NSS volunteers who participated.

20/08/2022: The NSS volunteers cleaned the chittur civil station and its surroundings offices like the Chittoor court, and the excise office.

Work started at 9:30 a.m. The work went smoothly and ended at 1 p.m. with a light meal served by officials at the civil station. There were 50 NSS volunteers who participated.

24/9/2022 was a significant day for every NSS volunteer because it marked the day when NSS was established. The volunteers observed NSS Day wearing the official uniform and participated in various events, such as hoisting the NSS flag and singing the NSS song. The day started with cleaning, inviting the principal to hoist the flag, and was successfully completed with the participation of 55 NSS volunteers.

On 28/9/2022, the NSS volunteers started preparing for a food festival at 8 AM. They sorted and arranged the food items brought from home, and cooked kappa and kanthari chammanthi in the canteen kitchen, guided by Suresh sir and Nishad teacher. Different stalls were arranged, and the dishes were sold out faster than expected. The event concluded with the participation of 51 NSS volunteers.

6 On 1/10/2022, work started at 9:30 AM, and the volunteers collected plastics from the college grounds. They also cleared small shrubs and creepers that had spread to the building, while some volunteers numbered the newly brought benches and desks. The day's work was completed with a light meal, and the NSS volunteers left, waiting for the next task. 50 NSS volunteers participated in this program.

The NSS students from Chittoor organized a quiz competition on 6/10/2022, in which many students participated. The competition had 50 tough and interesting questions, and Hathimtwai, the second year student of the English department, secured 36 marks. The event ended with NSS clap. Registered participation of 55 NSS volunteers.

On 12/10/2022, the KSEB staff Association and NSS Unit jointly organized a Power Quiz competition in the college. Around 50 students participated, and two students were selected for the district level competition. The event ended with the participation of 49 NSS volunteers.

On 15/10/2022, the NSS volunteers cleaned the college front and grounds as part of the campus cleaning program. The program started with the NSS song in the courtyard, and after 2 hours of hard work, the weeds and debris were removed successfully. The program ended with NSS clap and the participation of 55 NSS volunteers.

On 19/10/2022, the NSS organized a program to collect plastic waste from the college premises as part of Harita Kerala Mission. The plastic waste was kept

7 aside to be handed over to the municipal authorities, and the program ended with the participation of 50 NSS volunteers.

On 22/10/2022, the NSS volunteers and volunteers of Nehru Yuva Kendra collected plastic waste within a 2 km radius of the college. The volunteers of Nehru Yuva Kendra promised to collect and dispose of the garbage, and the event ended with refreshments and the participation of 51 NSS volunteers.

On 19/11/2022, the NSS volunteers started their work at 9:30 AM by cleaning the college and its premises. After that, a fun treasure hunt and debate were conducted, and all NSS volunteers participated enthusiastically. The program ended with the participation of 53 NSS volunteers.

On 26/11/2022, the NSS volunteers attended a theatre workshop at the college. The session started with the NSS prayer and was followed by the Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau's "Civil Death" play, which was entertaining and insightful. The program ended with NSS clap and the participation of 50 NSS volunteers.

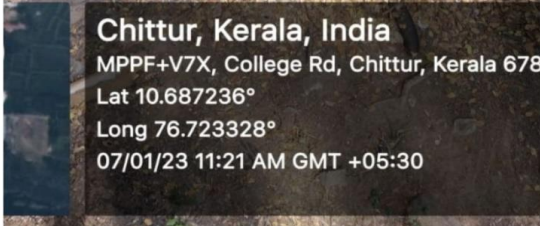

- Palakkad is a drought prone district in Kerala
- Rivers are polluted and the carrying capacity has reduced
- Palakkad river basins are rich in ponds and local water bodies
- The conservation of the traditional sources of water which could save the situation.
- Water availability in the basin can be improved by rejuvenating the ponds and keeping the rivers pollution free
- Units have had rejuvenated 20 ponds and 1 pond reconstruction projects till now.
- Revival process consists of removal of African weeds, water hyacinth, big grown grasses, African payal, water lettuce, water cress and plastics from the pond water.

- Revival of 19 ponds and 1 reconstruction, 2 well reconstructions, 1000 rain water harvesting pits at Eruthempathy Grama Panchayath, more than 10000 palm seed planting, organizing Water Conservation camps, Seminars and Film Exhibitions are the major programmes arranged under this scheme.
- River conservation activities : Continues involvement in cleaning activities about 2 kilometres area in chittur „Sokanasini“ river, about 1 kilometre of Sholayur river and about 1 kilometre at Gayathri river, Bamboo planting in the riversides, District level awareness programmes/camps.

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Reviving ponds set as agenda for water conservation

The NSS unit of the Government College, Chittur, devised a water conservation scheme 'Jalayanam' to save water for a better tomorrow

THE National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of the Government College, Chittur has proved the propaganda for the conservation of water does not remain confined to the social media alone. The unit has shown that in times of acute drinking water scarcity and serious drought faced by the people and the farmers, it is the conservation of water and its judicious use which could help save the situation. They have devised a water conservation scheme titled 'Jalayanam, save water for a better tomorrow.' This time we selected the Kottakulam located in the sixth ward of Thekkethara in Thenkuzhary," said K Pradheesh, programme officer of the NSS unit of the college.

The pond is spread over a 2.5-acre area. Around 50 volunteers under Pradheesh worked for more than six hours to remove the weeds and wild growth in the pond. They were also assisted by environmentalist Shyam Kumar and the locals.

For the last three years, the pond had not been cleaned. It was filled with water hyacinth and Salvinia molesta (a type of weed native to Africa) and was removed by the volunteers.

"It was part of the realisation that since rainfall has decreased over the years, it is the large number of ponds in Palakkad district which were vital for conserving water that made the NSS unit take up the pond renovation and cleaning programme as part of Jalayanam programme", said environmentalist Shyam Kumar.

"We had told the locals to clean the pond more than ten years ago. But it did not work. So last week, we took permission from the owner of the pond to get it cleaned," he added. The locals arranged for the refreshments for the volunteers.

The panchayat vice-president K Kavendran and ward member Loolavathi oversaw the cleaning process which began at 10 am and extended to nearly 5 pm.

The Palmyra trees (Karimban), the symbol of rural Palakkad, are felled in large numbers and sold to brick kilns in Tamil Nadu as firewood for many years.

The NSS unit of Government Chittar College has embarked on a mission to regain the palms symbolising the region's topography.

■ Palmyra trees were found to help store 20,000 litres of groundwater during rains

They lay Palmyra seeds with a target of 2,000 palms in and around the college along with other places in the district reeling under drought condi-



tions in almost all the summer seasons. A study conducted by Pondicherry University had found that a Palmyra helps store 10,000 to 20,000

litres of groundwater during rains due to the speciality of its trunk and deep roots.

"Farmers see them as obstacles on the ramps of paddy fields and farms," assistant professor K. Pradeesh, who is the NSS programme officer, said.

"The district witnessed rampant chopping of the palms and the trunk is sold to brick kiln agents in Tamil Nadu for just Rs 50 to 100 without knowing

the ecological value of the tree that bears palm fruit or ice apple."

The students had laid nearly 1,000 seeds on the bank of the Malampuzha Canal from Manamkalam near Thenkurissi to Banappuram last year. Out of them, 838 palms sprouted.

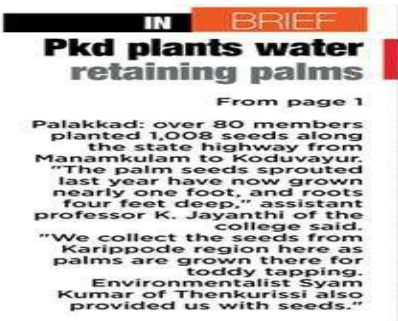

Flood Relief and Rehabilitation Activities

Achievements through the activities

- Active support in the camp centres
- More than 100 houses were cleaned during the flood time

Work at relief camp centres

NSS volunteers were engaged in camp related activities day and night at their native flood relief camps. 18 volunteers were worked at 6 camps in the district. Kanjikkode Apn ghar, Kollangode , MES College, Alampalam, Pirayiri, Pattanchery, etc. are the major camps in which the volunteers were engaged.



Donation activity

NSS Units collected Rs. 10000/- in a day and with the help of other agencies of RS.60000/- purchased dress materials like purdha, night weares, kids weares and inner wares for the peoples of relief camps especially at Cooperative college and MES college were the main distribution camps. Since it was of highly demanded, It got great appreciation in the camp on the day. Nearly 360 people got the benefit of the programme.



Work at collection centres

Volunteers were engaged in the collection centres mainly at Taluk office, Collectorate and indoor stadium Palakkad. Unloading, loading, sorting, arrangement and distribution of articles to various camps were the major activities associated with collection centres. 26 Volunteers were worked in a shift mode alternatively morning and evening



House cleaning activity

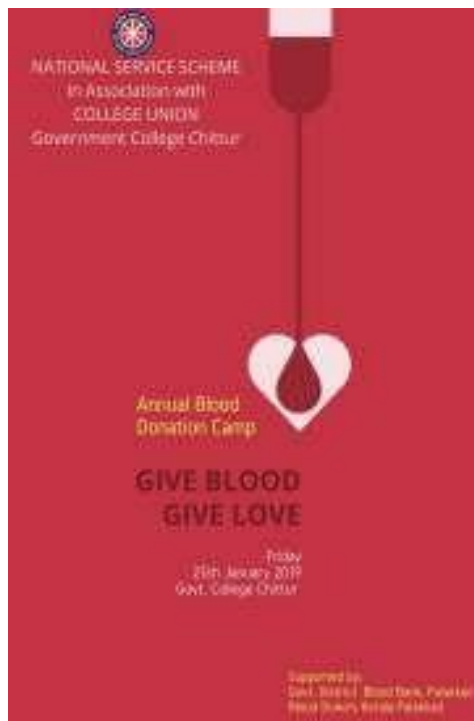

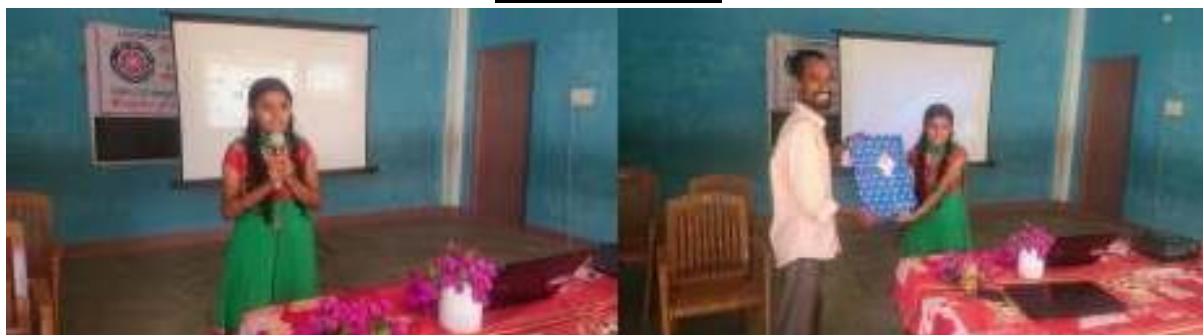

ACTIVITY 1: National Forest week (Van Mahotsav) observation (5/7/2022)

Chittoor Government College Platinum Jubilee Celebrations – House construction initiatives

The Platinum Jubilee (75th Anniversary) of Chittoor Government College was celebrated in a grand manner with a series of events till the month of August 2022. As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, the social responsibility of building houses for the homeless students of the college was undertaken by the students, teachers, alumni and volunteers of the college. The students who applied for the said housing scheme were included in the priority list

As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, it was decided to provide houses to the homeless students of the college. A specially prepared application was distributed to the children. A total of 14 applications were received from various departments with the recommendation of teachers. Pratish Kunchu, members of the Housing Committee, Dr. Murugan, Dr. Nisha Mol Mr. Ramabhadran, Dr. Manu Chakraborty and interviewed the children. The purpose of the interview was to inquire directly about the conditions at home of each one. The committee members then visited the homes of the students who had submitted their applications and saw the situation first hand. People who own at least 5 cents of land were selected for the housing project. The place should be in the name of the student or their parents. A priority list was prepared of the applications received using various criteria such as students whose parents have died, students whose parents are bed-ridden, and girls-only families. People who are unlikely to get a house in the government's life scheme have been selected for this. Students having healthy parents engaged in various occupations, students having more than 8 cents of land, families with only sons are not considered for the above application. The committee recommended 7 deserving students. The teachers and other employees of the college set aside a portion of their salary for this purpose. All the students of the college contributed whatever amount they could towards it. In addition, the students were able to raise funds for the construction of houses through voluntary organizations, charitable trusts, businessmen from various sectors and the CSR fund of the Kerala State Beverages Corporation. 430 square feet houses are being built. A maximum of Rs 6 lakh has been earmarked for a house. The families who were prepared earlier by the Foundation for the construction of houses required a maximum of Rs 4.5 lakh to complete the houses. 5 houses were completely completed and two houses were partially completed. Handing over of keys to all houses is expected in June 2023. The Platinum Jubilee Committee members came up with the idea of finding a deserving person and providing them with a house every year.



- Electronic display is placed in front of the principal office to display major activities of the colleges; it helps to minimize the use of flex boards.
- We have a public addressed system; most of the announcements are happened through this system.
- Students are asked to submit their copies of assignments in soft copy format.
- A good number of students rely on public transportation to reach campus. Only a small percentage of students use motor bikes for transportation.
- The whole pedestrian ways are interlocked for better water holding capacity, in an ecofriendly manner
- The roads are beautified with trees on both sides.

Waste management

- Dry –day observations has been conducting in first working day of every month
- E-waste management as per the directions of the Directorate of collegiate education department has been the part of the waste management practices of the committee
- Separate bins for different types of wastes are placed throughout the campus at important vantage points for proper collection and segregation of wastes.

- Vermicompost units are established in the campus for disposal of biodegradable wastes generated through garden trimming and vegetable wastes from the canteen and hostel mess.
- Biogas plants have been installed in the campus to convert the food waste generated into biogas.
- The college has taken initiatives to implement segregation of solid waste and hand over plastic waste for recycling and safe disposal instead of the unhealthy practice of burning it or dumping it in public places or water bodies.
- College has given special awareness programmes to laboratory safety measures and disposal of chemical waste in proper scientific way.
- College has installed incineration unit in the campus for hygiene and proper sanitation.
- The institution follows 'Green Protocol' while conducting seminars and other events .Students and faculty are encouraged to use steel glasses.
- The use of single use plastic is strictly banned within the campus. The college follows green protocol for all its official and public meetings seminars and conferences.
- College has established a plastic free zone around the campus
- Liquid waste management College encouraged the reuse of liquid solvents derived from laboratory and successfully implemented in the research as well as other laboratories.

Green landscaping

- The Green Protocol Committee is maintaining college garden which has a biodiversity rich botanical garden, with rare plant species.
- The garden act as an ecosystem for different birds and animals. Instead of that we have well maintained garden with beautiful leafy plants and flowering plants.
- Different varieties of trees have been planted in the campus and their names are displayed.
- Drip irrigation has promoted to reduce water usage.
- The trees in the campus are identified with their botanical names.

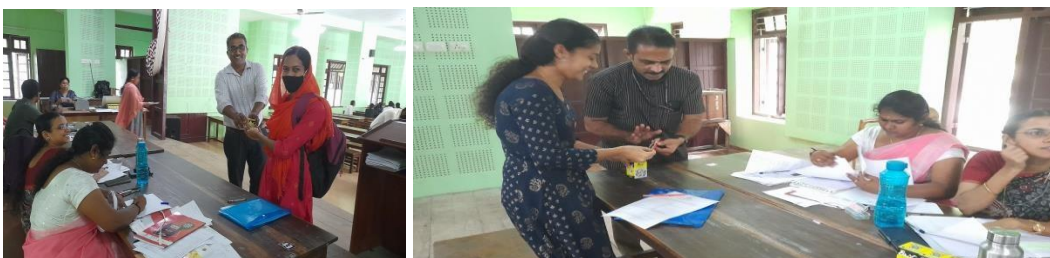

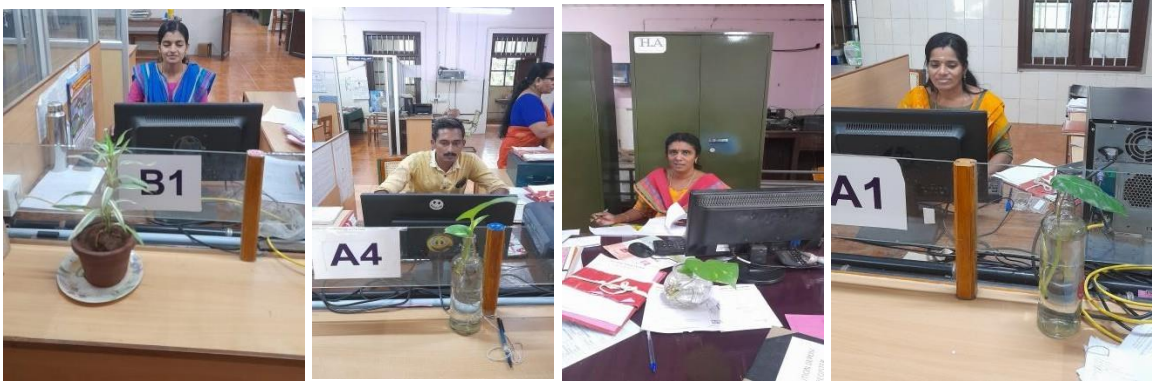
